• **Palisades Fall Trip** – Club members spent a glorious fall day visiting the Women's Federation Monument and the Kearney House in Palisades Interstate Park. The monument, built in 1929 on the cliffs overlooking the

Hudson River, and meant to evoke the ancient watchtowers along the Rhine River, honors the role that the NJ State Federation of Women's Clubs took in preserving the Palisades. The historic Kearney House served as a family homestead, a dockside tavern, and was known as the "Cornwallis Headquarters", as it was thought the British General stayed there for a night in 1776. The home was restored with the assistance of the NJFWC, and many of the furnishings were donated in the 1930s by Women's Clubs from across NJ.

• **Got Sneakers?** Did you know you can recycle your old sneakers and Franklin Woman's Club can earn money from it?

- \circ In the United States, at least 200 million pairs of shoes and sneakers end up in landfills each year.
- \circ $\,$ Shoes in landfills can take 30 to 40 years to decompose.
- The process of manufacturing sneakers produces large amounts of CO2 which contributes to the serious effects of climate change and global warming.

GotSneakers is a free sneaker recycling program. All reusable sneakers are recirculated to secondhand markets so people can access quality, pre-owned footwear at affordable prices. Those pairs that cannot be reused, will be recycled. The FWC will be collecting old (or new) pairs of sneakers and running shoes at every meeting, shipping them to GotSneakers (in their postage-paid bags) and receiving up to \$7.00 per pair! (Depending on condition.)

So, empty those closets and tell your family and friends. Bring your sneakers to the next FWC meeting or contact Nancy to arrange collection. Please note – non-athletic footwear will NOT be accepted. For more info, please see https://gotsneakers.com/ or contact me with any questions. Thank you!

The most recent GFWC alert focuses on supporting childhood global vaccination efforts as advocated by the United Nations Foundation Shot@Life Campaign.

In 2021 there was a worldwide decline in routine immunizations which has resulted in an increased spread of viruses around the globe. The GFWC is encouraging all members to contact their members of Congress and urge them to support full funding for various programs aimed at increasing access to vaccinations for the world's children.

Contacting your members of Congress in support of this effort or other GFWC approved initiatives couldn't be easier. The GFWC has drafted a message of support for each issue.
