Hello Everyone! It's a new year for Franklin Woman's Club and the Education & Libraries Committee is always welcoming new members. Anyone interested in joining this great committee, please feel free to contact me. Here is a description of the projects and activities that our committee has worked on in the past and will continue to do with your help this year.

Book Donations:

NJFWC members promote education in both children and adults. Projects in the Education and Libraries Community Service Program are designed to foster schools, as well as other educational institutions and opportunities, and to promote literacy, libraries, and the love of a good book. In 2022, Franklin



Woman's Club collected 1300 books and donated the books to three schools in Franklin Township and SCAP. We also participated in the Read Across America Program. We plan on doing this again in 2023.

• GCI:

Every year we sponsor a selection of Juniors from Franklin High School students to attend Girls' Career Institute (GCI). GCI offers a "mini college experience" at Douglass Residential College on the campus of Rutgers University. Delegates experience a sample of college life by living in a dorm, eating in a cafeteria, and attending lectures and workshops. They learn about career choices from volunteer professional speakers and how to network with other delegates from all over the state of New Jersey. Many establish lasting friendships with one another. FWC was fortunate to sponsor three delegates in 2022 and plan to do the same in 2023.

• Senior Scholarship:

FWC awards \$1000 in scholarship funds to young women who are in their senior year of high school, reside in Franklin Township and have been accepted to a two or four-year college. Our committee helps in reviewing applications and we select candidates based on the values that are in line with the FWC. The students are selected based on their involvement in community service, leadership, work experience, school activities, and academic accomplishments.

• **Fall Trip** – The Franklin Woman's Club is planning an outing to the Women's Federation Monument in Palisades Interstate Park (Alpine, NJ) on Sunday, October 22. (Last October we twice attempted to schedule this



trip but got rained out both days.) This "castle" was built in 1929 to honor the role that the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Clubs took in preserving the Palisades. We will carpool from the Senior/Community Center side parking lot, leaving at 9:30am. Election Day 2022 is only about a month away. You can find the answer to any question you might have about how and when to vote, including whether you are registered and the location of your polling place, by clicking on the NJ Voter Information Portal at https://nj.gov/state/elections/vote.shtml. You have your choice of three ways of voting this year: in-person on Election Day, in-person during the early voting period, or by mail (but only after submitting an application for a mail-in ballot to be sent to you).

A few key dates are:

October 18 – Last day to register to vote in the 2022 election

- October 29 November 6 Early in-person voting period
- November 1 Deadline to apply by mail for a mail-in ballot

November 8 - Election Day
